## 1. Decision:

- To proceed with the implementation of "No waiting at any time" waiting restrictions as advertised on parts of Windsor Drive, Cherry Tree Green, Bentley Road, Thieves Lane, Calton Avenue, Edmunds Road, Alexander Road, Sadiers Way and Chandler Way.
- To proceed with the implementation of "No waiting at any time" waiting restrictions
  with amendments to the advertised Notice at the junction of Norwood Close with
  Edmunds Road.

### 2. Reasons for the decision:

 The proposals are to introduce No waiting at any time waiting restrictions following concerns received about the current on-street parking causing reduced forward visibility and obstructing access at various junctions and locations identified.

Residents/businesses that were informally consulted were informed of the consultation results. The scheme was to progress to formal consultation.

During formal consultation, we received a reply from the Hertfordshire Constabulary (HC) who raised no objection.

There were 7 objections received during the formal stage:

- a) 1 from Alexander Road, Sadiers Way and Chandlers Way. The objector cited safety for children at St. Joseph's Roman Catholic school during drop-off/pick up time. The objector did not respond to the last communication from the Council via e-mail. His initial views were that the council wanted to put double yellow lines for the roads within the area.
- b) 5 from Bentley Road, Thieves Lane, Norwood Close, Edmunds Road and Windsor Drive citing lack of parking places in the area. 2 of the objectors have disabled children these were advised to apply for disabled parking where alternative parking can be provided (disabled parking).
- c) 1 from Calton Avenue and Edmunds Road citing lack of parking in the area.

## Considering the objections received:

There were concerns that the Council wanted to put double yellow lines affecting all roads within the area. This was not true and officers contacted the objectors and clarified that the measures are for junction protection only. Whilst sympathetic to lack of parking in the area, drivers should adhere to the Highway Code rules which prohibit parking within 10m of a

junction or bend. The measures proposed are considered to be the most effective way of deterring parking at various junctions and there is little scope for deviation.

Having fully considered the grounds of the objections it is considered that there is merit in proceeding to seal the order as originally proposed and as amended on part of Norwood Close/Edmunds Road.

The measures are consistent with the Highway Code (clause 243) which states that "Do not stop or park anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services, at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank, opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space, opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle, where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles, in front of an entrance to a property, on a bend, where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities except when forced to do so by stationary traffic."

# 3.1 Alternative options considered and rejected <sup>2</sup>

The only changes made are for Norwood Close/Edmunds Road where the double yellow lines are reduced to allow parking outside Nos 24 and 30/32. The rest of the other proposals remain unchanged throughout the process.
