1. Decision:

- To proceed with the implementation of "No waiting at any time" waiting restrictions as advertised on parts of Rye Road, Old Highway, Charlton Mead Lane, Middlefield Road, Stanstead Road, and Stanstead Road (Service Road).
- To proceed with the implementation of "Parking Places with 120 mins limited waiting no return within 180 mins effective between 8:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Saturday" on parts of Stanstead Road (Service Road).
- To proceed with implementation of "One Way traffic restriction on Stanstead Road (Service Road)."

2. Reasons for the decision:

- The proposals are to introduce No waiting at any time waiting restrictions following concerns received about the current on-street parking causing reduced forward visibility and obstructing access at various junctions and locations identified.
- To provide some short time parking facilities for shoppers along Stanstead Road (Service Road).
- To introduce one way traffic to facilitate free flow of traffic along Stanstead Road (Service Road).

The proposed schemes were designed to:

- Maintain access and visibility for both pedestrians and vehicular traffic,
- Ensure free flow of traffic and

Residents/businesses that were informally consulted were informed of the consultation results. The schemes were to progress to formal consultation.

During formal consultation, we received a reply from the Hertfordshire Constabulary (HC) who raised no objection.

There were 3 objections received during the formal stage from St. Cuthberts Road/Old Highway/Murchison. The objectors cited lack of parking places, unnecessary waste of public funds and consider making St. Cuthberts a one way. The Council was aware of the issues raised by some residents as these were considered and amended at the informal stage from the feedback received. Despite exchange of emails with objectors they have not acknowledged that their objections have been resolved to their satisfaction.

The measures are consistent with the Highway Code (clause 243) which states that "Do not stop or park anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services, at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank, opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space, opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle, where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles, in front of an entrance to a property, on a bend, where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities except when forced to do so by stationary traffic."

Having fully considered the grounds of the objections, the decision is to overrule the objections and proceed to sealing of the Order as advertised.

3.1 Alternative options considered and rejected ²

There were objections received at the informal stage concerning Old Highway junctions with Murchison Road and St. Cuthberts Road. The original proposals were amended following the feedback received.

There were no other alternative options considered for the other areas as the original options remained unchanged throughout the process.
