#### 1. Decision

- 1.1 That the Operations Director, Specialist Services has determined that Annex A to this Decision Record should not be disclosed to the public as it contains exempt information as defined by Section 100 of the Local Government Act 1972, Schedule 12A, the public Interest in maintaining the exemption outweighing the public interest in disclosing that information;
- 1.2 Subject to 1.1 above, awards the contract for the Provision of a Two bed Emergency Therapeutic residential unit for Children and Young People aged 11-16 with Challenging and Complex Needs (Hudnail Park) to the preferred provider set out in Annex A and approves the signing of the contract.

Price 40% Quality 60%

Two tender bids were received in response to this Invitation to Tender and each was evaluated against a pre-disclosed robust set of evaluation criteria.
