1. Decision

Whether or not to initiate a public consultation on the relocation of Breakspeare School, Abbotts Langley, WD5 0BU, to the Durrants School Former Playing Field site, Manor Green, Croxley Green, WD3 3LU and the permanent enlargement of the school from 97 to 210 places with effect from September 2023

2. Reasons for the decision

The proposal will support an increase in places available at Breakspeare School (the School), a community special school for children with severe learning difficulties (SLD), by 113 places. The current capacity of the school is 97 and with the proposed relocation and rebuild the capacity will increase to 210 places.

The current school site does not have enough space to create the additional accommodation required to cater for an increase in capacity. Hertfordshire County Council (the county council) is therefore proposing to relocate the School to Croxley Green in new, purpose-built, accommodation which will fully meet the needs of both existing and new children.

New special school places are urgently required to meet the demand for children, aged 2yrs to 19yrs with severe learning difficulties. All existing SLD schools are full and there is no remaining expansion potential. The School has been chosen for enlargement as it is the SLD school with the most unmet demand for places across the county.

The School is a community special school for children with SLD needs aged 2-19 yrs. It currently has 97 pupils on roll. The School is now at full capacity and there is no further expansion potential on the site. All other SLD schools are also full and have no enlargement potential.

The School was last inspected by Ofsted in 2017, when it was rated Outstanding.

The existing School was built in 1947, originally as an infant mainstream school and therefore lacks many specialist and design features that the county council we would look for to meet the needs of pupils with SLD needs. It is not possible to improve the functionality of the buildings: due to the layout of the main building, lack of space, old infrastructure and cost efficiency.

The county council is proposing to relocate the School from its existing site in Abbots Langley to the Durrants School Former Playing Field, Manor Green,

Croxley Green, WD3 3L (the Durrants site), a straight-line distance of 3.3 miles.

The new school building, at the Durrants site, would be a purpose-built special school, designed to current DfE standards for special schools¹ to meet the needs of pupils with severe learning difficulties. It will accommodate up to 210 pupils in vastly improved accommodation and would significantly improve the educational offer for children attending the school.

The proposed new site and building would offer a positive opportunity for the School to operate in new, purpose-built accommodation that is better suited to meet the needs of children and young people with severe learning difficulties. It will create places in an area of high demand meaning that new pupils will be able to secure a school place that is closer to home.
