Edwina Grant OBE is a consultant to The Centre for Family Safeguarding, alongside other work she does with the Chartered Institute of Public Sector accountants (CIPFA), Whole Education, Newton, and several local authorities.

She was Director of Children's Services (DCS) in four councils, the London Borough of Redbridge, Nottingham City Council, Central Bedfordshire Council, and Lancashire County Council.

Redbridge was one of two councils that trailed the concept of the DCS post back in 2003, before the Children Act 2004, so she has a good sense of social care developments and emergent issues that affect DCS's and councils at executive level since then.

Steph has led strategic partnership arrangements alongside improvement in service delivery supporting Local Authorities to achieve Ofsted 'Good' ratings. She led a prominent South-East unitary authority through their Family Safeguarding journey from 2017-2022 and their achievements were commended by Ofsted. Inspectors found that there had been a significant reduction in the number of children subject to a child protection plan, children entering care, repeat domestic abuse call outs and mental health crises. Steph was also the project lead for introducing a Pre-Proceedings Protocol working with the judiciary and local solicitors to achieve commitment to exiting pre proceedings and using pre proceedings as an opportunity to change as opposed to gathering evidence.

In 2022 Steph completed her Master's in Advanced Child Protection with distinction whereby her dissertation focused on creating the right culture in social work to achieve permanent committed Social Workers who feel valued and respected, that in turn can create change 'with' families to enable children to remain at home. She firmly believes that Family Safeguarding practice and principles enhance practitioner's ability to create positive change.

Steph has been working collaboratively with BASW to promote their 80:20 campaign promoting relationship based practice in social work.
