This course will enable you to carry out a primary survey of the incident. You will be shown how to place someone in the recovery position and administer CPR. You will be taught how to recognise and treat bleeding and shock; bone, joint and muscle injuries; chocking, asthma and hyperventilation; and burns.

Mandatory for ALL Foster Carers

This course aims to provide you with the knowledge to keep both yourself as a Foster Carer, and your foster children safe. You will gain an understanding of the need for safer caring guidelines and procedures and what these mean for you. You will be shown how to recognise risky situations and how to manage these with agreed strategies. You will be supported to know how and why you need to create and update a family safer caring plan and learn how to develop good partnership relationships with everyone involved in the care of the foster child.

Safeguarding for Foster Carers

Course: Safeguarding for Foster Carers (learningpool.com)

Mandatory for ALL Foster Carers to be renewed every 3 years

This course will provide you with an understanding of the key safeguarding issues and legislation regarding a looked after child and how to promote safe practice in the workplace. You will Understand concepts of Safeguarding & Child Protection, how they relate to role with children looked after and your responsibilities for safeguarding children in your care. You will be able to recognise and respond to concerns in a timely and appropriate way and understand how to share information appropriate with other professionals involved with the care of the child.

This training is split into two parts:

1. Complete the Safeguarding and Child Protection iLearn module (this only needs to be completed once).

Course: ARC for Foster Carers (learningpool.com)

Mandatory for ALL Foster Carers

This training is delivered in four parts, looking first at our shared understanding of attachment theory and what is understood as "developmental trauma". The next three training sessions focus on the three tiers of the theory itself, understanding approaches and interventions crucial to supporting children's attachments, ways of teaching and supporting self-regulation, before helping children and young people develop the mastery, they need to be competent in essential areas of human functioning.

Fostering and Adoption Transitions

Course: Hertfordshire Transitions Training for Fostering and Adoption (learningpool.com)

In Hertfordshire we the Hertfordshire Model when transitioning children from foster parents to adoptive parents and from short to long term fostering.

The Hertfordshire model of transitions aims to address concerns around when children move to an adoptive family, particularly when their feelings of loss and separation can be overlooked. This is especially true for transitions which happen over a short time period and when contact with foster carers ends abruptly. The model is underpinned by the University of East Anglia Transitions framework based on six key principles for providing therapeutic caregiving in foster care and adoption, the Secure Base model.

Moving and Handling

This course will give you an understanding of the importance of working in a way to ensure your back is cared for. You will look at the risks of working at low levels and on the floor and consider potential solutions to minimise the risks with this. You will look at how you can support children with care needs and/or a disability whilst also supporting and encouraging independence.

You will have the opportunity to practice using a range of large and small handling equipment designed to aid transferring children and young people in line with current accepted good practice, as well as discussing and practicing a range of techniques and strategies for working with children and young people requiring assistance with mobility. There will be the opportunity to explore various unexpected situations and considered solutions to problems such as falling, and dealing with a fallen
