The Hertfordshire Design Review Panel operates to help planning authorities,

project teams and their clients realise the full potential of development schemes in Hertfordshire.

Design Review is impartial, practical, site and scheme specific and relates to national and international standards of good practice as well as local planning and contextual issues. It is most effective if done at the early stages of design and planning to enable applicants to take positive action based on the advice provided via the review process. Design review is not an end in itself but a valuable addition to existing planning mechanisms, helping to achieve better outcomes.

The Hertfordshire Design Review Panel has been in operation since 2011 as a practical addition to the Building Futures initiative. It is multi-disciplinary in its composition and can therefore review schemes of various scales, types and contexts and provide advice across a wide range of issues: architecture, urban design, master planning, planning, landscape, sustainability, transport, ecology, historic environment and engineering.
