## Evidence Questionnaire in Support of the Registration of Land as a New Town or Village Green

(based on the Evidence Form produced by the Open Spaces Society)

## Please note:

- The purpose of this form is to help establish whether or not the land claimed is a town or village green. You are asked to complete the questions as fully and as accurately as possible. Hertfordshire County Council ("HCC"), as the registration authority, will be able to make a more accurate decision the more information is available.
- The information you give in this form cannot be treated as confidential. To determine the application it may be necessary for HCC to disclose information received from you to others, which may include other local authorities, the Planning Inspectorate and other Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public. If the application proceeds to a public inquiry your evidence will be made available to the inquiry.
- A public inquiry may be held if HCC proceeds with the application but it is contested (e.g. by a landowner). Public inquiries are usually held locally (i.e. in the village hall). If you are unable to attend a public inquiry your evidence may be given in writing, but user evidence is of much greater value if the witness attends in person and is prepared to answer questions on his or her evidence. It is for this reason that you are asked if you are prepared to attend such an inquiry (see Question 24).
- Reference in this form to "the Land" means the land that is subject to the town or village green application.
- As part of the application the applicant has to identify
  - a) the Land by means of a map; and
  - b) the "locality" or "neighbourhood within a locality" where the local inhabitants who claim to have used the Land live. This is usually done by means of map. A copy of this map should be attached to this form. A locality is a legally recognised administrative area such as a parish or electoral ward. A neighbourhood is a more flexible concept and need not have legally significant boundaries. However there must be a sufficient degree of cohesiveness within the community on which the neighbourhood is based. This is more than just a line drawn on a map.
