

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF A DIVERSION ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 119

**HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BRAUGHING FOOTPATH 3)
DIVERSION ORDER 2019**

On 19th July 2019, Hertfordshire County Council confirmed the above Order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public footpath, running from its junction with Braughing Restricted Byway 31 at TL 4111 2727 continuing generally west through the garden of Bozengreen Farm for approx 65m to TL 4105 2726 to a line running from a junction with Braughing Restricted Byway 31 at TL 4112 2730 continuing generally west and south south west for approximately 100 metres inside and contiguous with the northern and western boundary of the garden to TL 4105 2726 as shown on the Order Plan.

A copy of the Order and the Order plan may be seen free of charge at front reception of Hertfordshire County Council, County Hall, Hertford, from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm on Monday to Friday and at East Herts District Council, Wallfields, Pegs Lane, Hertford, SG13 8EQ. Copies of the Order and Plan may be bought at the price of £5.

The Order comes into force as from 8th August 2019, but if any person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 8th August 2019, make an application to the High Court.

This Order is made by Hertfordshire County Council ("the authority") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owner of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this Order it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

Dr Paul Sharpe and Mrs Pamela Sharpe have agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public.

East Herts District Council has been consulted as required by section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

1. The public right of way over the land situate at Braughing and shown by a bold continuous line on the plan contained in this Order ("the Order Plan") and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up on the date on which the authority certifies that the public footpath described in paragraph 2 below is in fit condition for use by the public such date not being earlier than 90 days from the date of confirmation of this Order.
2. There shall at the end of 90 days from the date of confirmation of this Order be a public footpath over the land situate at Braughing described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the Order Plan.
3. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.







SCHEDULE

PART 1

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF EXISTING PATH OR WAY

The full width of that part of Braughing Footpath 3 from its junction with Braughing Restricted Byway 31 at TL 4111 2727 (Point A on the Order Plan) continuing generally west through the garden of Bozengreen Farm for approximately 65 metres to TL 4105 2726 (Point B on the Order Plan).

PART 2

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF NEW PATH OR WAY

Commences at a junction with Braughing Restricted Byway 31 at TL 4112 2730 (point C on the Order Plan) continuing generally west and south south west for approximately 100 metres inside and contiguous with the northern and western boundary of the garden to TL 4105 2726 (Point B on the Order Plan).

Width: 3 metres subject to mature trees.
