

**PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 118**

**HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL**

**Hertfordshire County Council (Sandon 32) Extinguishment Order 2011**

This Order is made by Hertfordshire County Council ("the authority") under section 118 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that the footpath described below is not needed for public use.

North Hertfordshire District Council have been consulted as required by section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER

1. The public right of way over the land situate at Sandon shown by a continuous bold line on the plan forming part of this Order ("the Order Plan") and described in the Schedule to this Order shall be extinguished on the date of confirmation of this Order.
2. Confirmation of this Order shall be concurrent with the confirmation of the "Hertfordshire County Council (Sandon 32) Creation Order 2011".

**SCHEDULE**

**DESCRIPTION OF PATH TO BE EXTINGUISHED**

The full width of that part of Sandon 32 from the outer eastern corner of Tichney Wood at Point A on the Order Plan (TL 3282 3388) in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 215 meters to Point G on the Order Plan (TL 3284 3366).



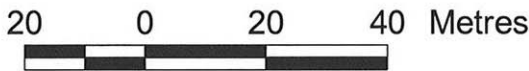

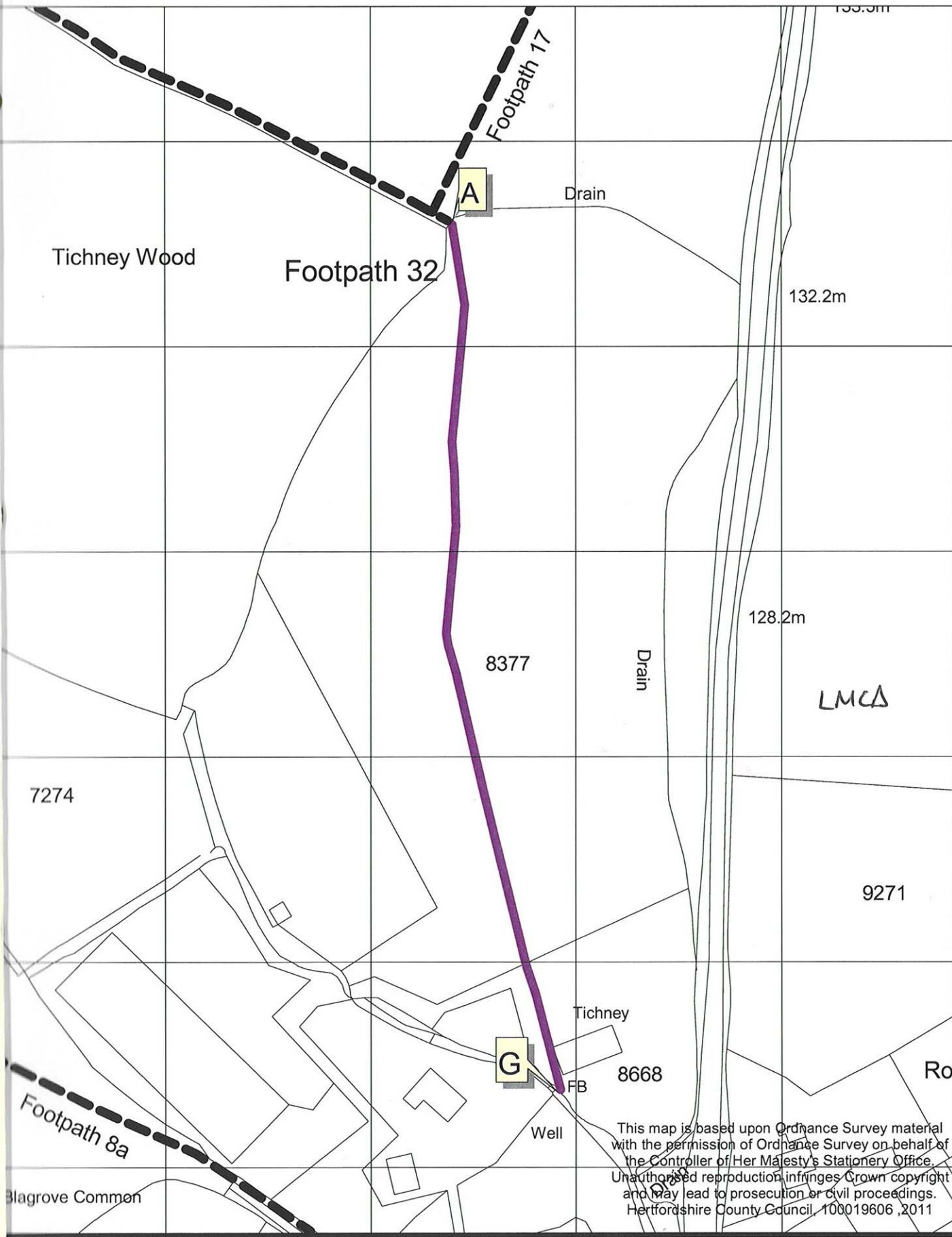
