

The Highways Act 1980

The Hertfordshire County Council (A120 (Little Hadham) Bypass Classified Road)

(Side Roads) Order 2017

Hertfordshire County Council (the "Council") hereby give notice that it has made, and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order under Sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 –

1. Authorising the Council to:-
 - a. improve highways (including raising, lowering or otherwise altering);
 - b. stop up highways;
 - c. construct new highways;
 - d. stop up private means of access to premises; and
 - e. provide new means of access to premises;

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road known as the A120 (Little Hadham) Bypass which the Council is proposing to construct between a point on the A120 650m west of the junction with C15 Albury Road and extending in a generally easterly direction, for a distance of 3900 metres, to a point on the A120 2.5km east of the junction with C15 Albury Road.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 10 August 2017 at the offices of Hertfordshire County Council, (Main Reception) County Hall, Pegs Lane, Hertford, Hertfordshire, SG13 8DN and East Hertfordshire District Council office, Charrington House, Bishop's Stortford, Hertfordshire, CM23 2EN and Environment Agency office, Apollo Court, 2 Bishops Square Business Park, St Albans Road West, Hatfield, Hertfordshire, AL10 9EX.

ANY PERSON may not later than 30 September 2017 object to the confirmation of the Order by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport, National Transport Casework Team, Department for Transport, Tyneside House, Skinnerburn Road, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE4 7AR stating the grounds of their objection.

In submitting an objection it should be noted that your personal data and correspondence will be passed to the Council to enable your objection to be considered. If you do not wish your personal data to be forwarded, please state your reasons when submitting your objection and the Secretary of State will copy your representations, with your name and address removed to the Council, and if there is to be a Public Local Inquiry they will be seen by the Inspector who may give them less weight as a result.
