ANNUAL STATISTICAL REPORT SCHOOL ADMISSION AND EXCLUSION APPEALS SEPTEMBER 2015 TO AUGUST 2016

SCHOOL ADMISSION APPEALS

- The following statistics include statutory appeals for community and voluntary-controlled schools, plus Academies, voluntary-aided and foundation schools for whom Customer Service provide a clerking service.

The number of appeals lodged differs from the number of appeals heard. This is because some do not proceed to a hearing either because a place is offered at their preferred school, or parents withdraw their appeal.

The actual difference in number overall was a decrease of 51 appeals.

Secondary transfer appeals administered by Customer Service for the 2016/17 school year, heard in the summer term 2016, 11% down on those for secondary transfer 2015. The actual difference was a decrease of 61 appeals. Primary Reception appeals administered by Customer Service for the 2016/17 school year, heard in the summer term 2016, were 35% down on those for primary reception 2015/16. The actual difference was an increase of 107 appeals.

HOME TO SCHOOL TRANSPORT APPEALS

Appeals for free home to school transport – all schools and academies

The home to school travel and transport statutory guidance issued by the Department for Education in July 2014, introduced a structured two stage review process allowing parents to challenge decisions taken by the local authority in relation to home to school transport. Stage one ensures a review of the parent's application by a senior officer and stage two allows the parent to request a review by an independent appeal panel. The figures below cover the first full academic year showing the number of parents that progressed their application to an independent panel and the outcomes.

SCHOOL EXCLUSION REVIEWS

School Exclusion Reviews – all schools and academies

Following a review there are three options open to the panel: to uphold the decision to exclude; recommend that the governing body reconsiders its decision, or quash the decision and direct that the governing body considers the exclusion again. The final option imposes a £4,000 fine if the governing body does not offer to reinstate the pupil within 10 days of being notified of the review panel's decision.

- In 2015/2016 there were 7 applications for review lodged by parents against the permanent exclusion of their child from a Hertfordshire school/academy. One application was subsequently withdrawn so only 6 reviews were considered by an independent panel. In one case the panel decided to uphold the decision to exclude, in another the panel concluded that the decision to exclude the pupil was so flawed that they quashed the decision and directed that the governing body consider the exclusion again. In the remaining four cases the panel found there to be procedural improprieties which had had a**

significant impact on the quality of the decision making process. Therefore, the panel recommended in each of these cases that the governing body reconsider their decision.
